IKF World Ranking 2008

While Netherlands and Belgium have retained their top position in the most recent IKF World Ranking, the recent results at the World Championship have caused some substantial changes further down.

Chinese Taipei and the Czech Republic have again changed places, with the Czechs currently ranked third following their bronze medal win at the World Championship.

Portugal and Russia have substantially risen in the recent ranking, while India has made the top-12. Countries that have suffered include Germany and Poland.

The top six countries from the new World Ranking will be invited for the World Champions Trophy, a new IKF event with ranking points to be earned, which is due to be held later this year.

General Principles of the IKF Ranking

Sunday, 03 October 2004 00:00

General Principles

- 1) If a team does not enter an event then it gets 0.
- 2) If a team cannot enter an event because it does not qualify for the main event because of its position in the Continental event they not are penalised further. In these cases they are ranked below the teams in the main event. If they do not enter the qualifying event they get 0.

IKF World Championship

- 1) Points allocated according to position 20 down to 1. (From 2007 World Championship onwards this will be 24 down to 1).
- 2) Weighting 5

IKF Continental Championship

- 1) Points allocated according to position 16 down to 1 in Europe (including those who failed to qualify at first round event). From 2010 this will be from 20 down to 1.
- 2) The differences in standards between Europe and AOKF is taken into account by starting AOKF at 14 (= 3rd Europe), with 2nd place 11 (= 6th Europe) then 7 pts, followed by 5 down to 1. In 2010 AOKF will start at 18, second place 16, then 12, then 10 down to 1.
- 3) A country without a CC in the same year as a Europe or AOKF Championship is allocated an arbitrary set total of 9. From 2010 this will be 12.
- 4) If a continent other than the AOKF and Europe has an event in the same year as the AOKF or Europe then 1st will get 12, 2nd 8, 3rd 5 and then 3 down to 1.
- 5) Weighting 3

IKF U23 World Championship

- 1) Points allocated according to position 14 down to 1.
- 2) Weighting 2.5
- 3) Those who entered their Continental event but were not invited to go to the U23 WC will get some points e.g. next highest in Europe would be placed 11th, next highest in AOKF 12th, and next highest in Europe 13th. Until the standard in other continents is known the positions will be allocated below the lowest Asia/European position.

IKF U21 Continental Championship

- 1) Points allocated according to position from 14 down to 1 in Europe. From 2010 16 down to 1
- 2) The differences in standards between Europe and AOKF is taken into account by starting AOFK at 12 (= 3rd Europe), with 2nd place 9 (= 6th Europe) then 6 pts, followed by 4 down to 1. From 2010 these will be 14, 11, 8, 6 down to 1
- 3) A country without a CC in the same year as a Europe or AOKF Championship is allocated an arbitrary set total of 7. From 2010 this will be 9.
- 4) If a continent other than the AOKF and Europe has an event in the same year as the AOKF or Europe then 1st will get 9, 2nd 6, 3rd 4 and then 3 down to 1.
- 5) Weighting 1

World Games

- 1) Points allocated 6 down to 1. From 2009 this will be 8 down to 1.
- 2) Weighting 2.5

IKF Asia Championship, IKF Oceania Championship, IKF European Bowl and other IKF continental events in non-qualifying years

1) The aim for these events is to allow a change in the lower positions in the ranking tables. These are now included but teams inside the top 10 in the overall rankings may not earn points. Points will range from 8 down to 1. If there are two or more pools the points will be allocated separately to each pool. If there is a final play-off the winner will get a 3 point bonus.

Weightings for years

- 1) Years go from 1 November to 31 October (particularly as the World Championship is in November).
- 2) The current year has a weighting of 1
- 3) The previous year has a weighting of 0.75, then the year before is 0.5 and 0.25 will follow.

IKF Continental Championship more frequently than 4 years

1) If a Continental Federation has more than 1 championship in the 4 year cycle that we only count the ones used as qualification for our WC and U23 WC.
